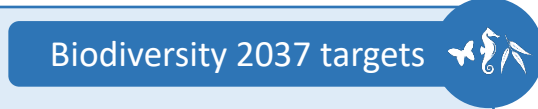




Process

A score from 1-7 is given for each Criteria and then adjusted by the weighting percentage. Scores are then calculated, producing a ranking list of all applications. The top scoring applications will be awarded successful.

Projects that address *Protecting Victoria's Environment - Biodiversity 2037* targets will be preferred.



Does the project address the following themes?

- Threatened species
- Threatened communities
- Biodiversity threats
- Predation (predator and herbivore)

Does the project include the following activities?

- Habitat restoration and/or revegetation
- Weed control
- Scientific research
- Predation control

Innovation Weight = 40%

Other Elements

- How well does the project address the following definition: *Something new or different that creates value.*
- Does the project invoke a change?
- Does the project develop new and different approaches to volunteering?

Volunteerism Weight = 30%

Description
Does the project address the 'Victorians Volunteering for Nature, Environmental Volunteering Plan'?

Other Elements

- Will the project increase the number of:
 - volunteers participating for the first time
 - diversity of people volunteering
 - volunteering opportunities not offered
 - volunteer partnerships
- Will the project improve:
 - the ability to retain, support & grow volunteering
 - volunteer management
 - inclusivity & accessibility to volunteers & visitors
 - understanding of environmental volunteering
- Will the project celebrate & promote the benefits of volunteering?

Merit Weight = 20%

Description
What are the overarching benefits of the project?

Other Elements

- What are the benefits to the environment?
- What are the intangible benefits?
- What is the extent of community support for the project (including Traditional Owners)?
- Is the project culturally sensitive and appropriate?
- Are the costs appropriate for the project?
- Are there other contributions to the project?
- Have sources of funding been clearly identified?
- Is the volunteer group contributing towards the project?
- Can funding be better sourced elsewhere?

Legacy Weight = 10%

Description
Will the project leave a legacy?

Other Elements

- Can the project be expanded?
- Can the project be continued in the future?
- Does the project develop sustainable models of volunteering?
- Can the project provide lessons for the future?
